



















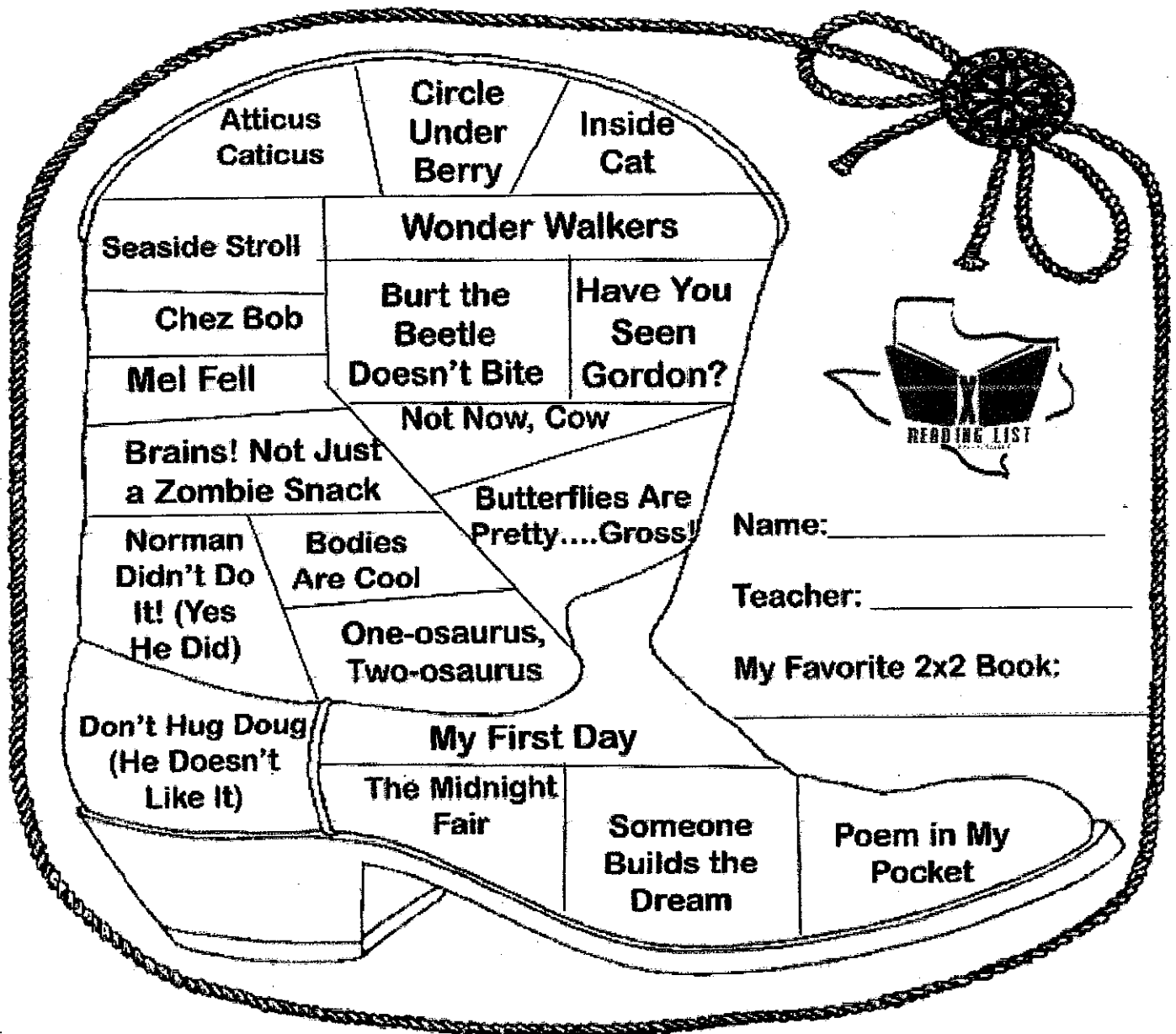

***Thirteen Witches: The Memory Thief***, by Jodi Lynn Anderson

**How this book stands out:** Rosie's mother has never seemed to care much about her daughter. When Rosie learns her mother has been cursed by a witch who steals memories, she goes on a quest to find them.

***The In-Between***, by Rebecca K.S. Ansari

**How this book stands out:** Cooper is hooked by a mystery when he realizes the creepy girl next door has the same crest on her jacket as two unidentified children from an historical disaster.

***Letters from Cuba***, by Ruth Behar

**How this book stands out:** Esther and her father escape the Nazis in Poland to live in Cuba where they work to make money to save the rest of their family.

***The Blackbird Girls*** by Ahne Blankman

**How this book stands out:** Valentina and Oksana have always been more enemies than friends, but when the nearby Chernobyl nuclear power plant explodes, they must rely on each other for survival.

***City of the Plague God*** by Sarwat Chadda

**How this book stands out:** Sik's world turns upside down when Nergal, the Mesopotamian god of plagues destroys his family's dell. Now it's up to Sik to stop him or the whole city will be overrun with a deadly plague.

**Ground Zero** by Alan Gratz

**How this book stands out:** Brandon is trapped on an elevator and fighting to survive when an airplane hits the World Trade Center. Eighteen years later, Rashmina is in a struggle of her own as war ravages her Afghan village.

**Hide and Seeker** by Daka Hermon

**How this book stands out:** Justin and his friends are trapped in a nightmare world with the Seeker who makes them constantly relive their greatest fears.
